



HOUSE RULES

The museum welcomes visitors to its facilities during opening hours. Please note that different opening hours apply to special museum facilities (e.g. library, graphic art archive).

Admission fees are charged for visits to the collections, special exhibitions and events.

The works of art entrusted to the museum, most of which are public property or private loans, are presented in such a way that our visitors can view them undisturbed, comfortably and at their convenience. However, the museum is obliged to protect them.

For this reason, we ask you to observe the following house rules:

1. For safety reasons, backpacks, bicycle helmets, umbrellas, (selfie) sticks, bulky items – e.g. camera tripods – and bags, pouches or containers larger than 30 x 25 cm (approx. A4 size) are not permitted in the exhibition rooms and library. Please leave raincoats, coats and similar items in the cloakroom. Coats and jackets must not be carried over the arm. Lockers are available free of charge. To carry personal items with you, please use transparent bags, which are available at the ticket office. No liability can be accepted for items left in the cloakroom. If, in exceptional cases and for understandable reasons, items or items of clothing cannot be left in the cloakroom, we reserve the right to inspect them.
2. Animals are not permitted in the museum. Exceptions are made for medically certified assistance dogs (e.g. guide dogs, epilepsy dogs, etc.).
3. For fire safety reasons, smoking is prohibited in the museum.
4. For conservation reasons, it is generally not permitted to touch the artworks. We kindly ask you to ensure that even accidental contact with artworks is prevented by maintaining a reasonable distance. In some cases where conservation is not an issue, we invite you to touch the sculptures. These artworks are marked accordingly or can be touched under professional supervision.
5. In the interests of all visitors, we ask you to avoid unnecessary noise and to treat all museum furnishings with care. We particularly ask children visiting us not to run, roller skate or use the lifts unnecessarily.
6. The consumption of food and beverages is restricted to the restaurant, foyer and entrance hall.
7. Filming and photography in the museum is permitted for private purposes without flash or tripods. The personal rights (in particular the right to one's own image) of visitors and museum staff must be respected. Commercial or editorial photo, film and audio recordings require written permission from the Sprengel Museum Hannover.
8. The instructions of the supervisory staff must be followed.

These house rules are binding for all our visitors.

The management and staff of the museum ask for your understanding regarding these regulations, which are intended to ensure an undisturbed visit to the museum and the preservation of the works of art.
